20th year of 100 percent Matric pass rate at UJ Metropolitan Academy

The 2014 Matric class of Johannesburg's UJ Metropolitan Academy (ex Raucall), a beneficiary of Metropolitan through the MMI Foundation, has produced a 100% pass rate.

This is the 20th year a 100% pass rate has been obtained since the school's inception 23 years ago in 1992 with the financial assistance of Metropolitan.
